

Zoning & Land Use Committee Updates

3320 Elm Ave

(Lot next to 3318 Elm Ave)

Ms. Cheryle Wilson presented plans to the HCC ZLUC to construct a detached house with two apartments on a vacant lot on Elm Ave. She purchased the lot located between 3318 Elm Ave and the corner of Harding Pl which had outstanding tax liens. Her plans call for a three-story house with a similar design to the neighboring houses on the same side of the street, with two twobedroom apartments - one on two levels and one on the top level. Two single-car garages with a driveway and space for two additional off-street parking spaces is planned in the rear (facing Falls Cliff Rd). The front of the building will have a porch placed in line with the frontage of neighboring houses, and the overall building will be deeper and wider than neighboring homes, built to the side property line. The owner is also considering building a fence near the street along Harding Pl and Falls Cliff Rd.

The proposal requires an appeal for several variances from the Board of Municipal Zoning Appeals (BMZA) related to setbacks from the property lines, amount of the lot covered by impervious surface, and minimum lot size per dwelling unit. A hearing has been scheduled for April 23 at 1pm.

The HCC ZLUC facilitated a meeting between the owner and the immediately affected neighbors on the block, including Councilwoman Mary Pat Clarke. Topics of discussion included size of the building, blocking views from neighbors' rear yards, vehicular safety of the driveway at the intersection of Falls Cliff Rd, Harding Pl and Roland Ave, disruption during construction, and parking. A compromise solution was not reached. The HCC is working with neighbors and the Councilwoman to advocate for the interests of current residents before the BMZA.

3500 Chestnut Ave (Bodhi Corner)

The proprietors of the Thai restaurant Bodhi Corner have a hearing before the BMZA requesting to allow outdoor seating for 9 tables and 18 chairs for the premises. According to the plans, one table would be on Chestnut Ave and the remaining eight tables would be on W 35th St. The HCC has contacted the proprietors to have a presentation at the April HCC general meeting. The hearing is scheduled for May 7 at 1pm.

3437 Hickory Ave

The owner of this rowhouse presented to the ZLUC on plans for a first- and secondfloor rear addition. The proposal requires a BMZA appeal for variances to be heard in a hearing scheduled for April 23. The owner is working to confirm neighbor support for the plans.

New Wayfinding Signs Tell the Story of Hampden's Industrial History

With grant funding from the Baltimore The signs are located at: National Heritage Area, Hampden residents and Greater Hampden Heritage Alliance members Nathan Dennies and Paula Bogert worked with Preservation Maryland to complete a two-year project to illustrate the labor history of the Jones Falls Valley by researching, designing, and installing eight new interpretative signs at historic factory sites.

The Jones Falls provided the power that fueled manufacturing in Baltimore in the 19th and 20th centuries. The string of mills built in the valley along the river had an indelible economic and social impact on the surrounding areas. Each of these signs, installed in pedestrian-friendly and active areas, helps tell the stories of the people who worked in the mills and provides context for the neighborhood's sustained redevelopment. Each sign includes a multiple access points for information via a map, architectural diagrams, and historic photographs.

- Mt. Washington Mill
- Tribute Home Care
- Clipper Mill
- Meadow Mill
- Enoch Pratt Free Library Branch No. 7 (to be installed later)
- Whitehall Mill
- Mill No. 1
- Mill Center

Additional support for many of the signs came from the generosity of the current property owners including Clipper Mill Property Owners Association, Himmelrich Associates, Remington Properties, and Terra Nova Ventures, who will own and maintain the signs. The Baltimore Architecture Foundation also served as a partner.

These signs offer the opportunity for the public to experience a self-guided tour of the Jones Falls Valley, but that experience does not stop at the signs.


Enoch Pratt President Heidi Daniel's Presidential Letter

Summer is a season for change. And we're excited to announce some big changes to the Pratt Library's Hampden branch. The 119-year old branch on Falls Road is getting a modern day makeover which also keeps the historic features the community loves. The full renovation will double the usable space of the community library by making the basement usable for the public and staff. When the branch reopens, customers will be able to utilize a beautiful new meeting room outfitted with the latest technology. Public restrooms will also be available downstairs.

The Hampden branch, once known as Branch Number 7, opened in 1900 thanks to a donation from local industrialist Robert Poole. The renovation will maintain the historic charm of both the library's main floor and the exterior architecture of the building. A new ramp system will be built outside, as well as a lift inside, to make the library accessible to all.

The renovation project at Hampden is expected to take about two years. But, we want to continue library service to that community. So, we're partnering with

6. Should your proposal include construction, landscaping or workshop supplies, please supply additional documentation with budget, quotes, timeline, drawings and/or pictures.

7. If you are partnering with other organizations and/or volunteer groups, please indicate those groups on a second page as well as their URLs.
