Zoning & Land Use Committee Updates

3827 Falls Rd

(Good Neighbor)

At the September HCC general meeting, Shawn Chopra presented his concept for a retail establishment mixing a café with artisan home goods and furnishings in the old Sirkis Hardware location. The café would be open for coffee and light meals. Many of the home furnishing vendors will be local. The proprietor also applied for a new Class "B" restaurant Beer Wine Liquor license. The liquor license will primarily be for weekends and events, featuring a small beverage menu. The establishment will have 75-80 seats (as required for the license). While café/retail hours can differ, alcohol sales will not start before llam during the week and 9am for weekend brunch, and will end by 9pm during the week and 10pm on weekends. The HCC negotiated a memorandum of understanding with the proprietor to provide certain terms for the liquor license. At its October 24 hearing, the Board of Liquor License

Commissioners (BLLC) for Baltimore City approved the application for a new license. The establishment is under construction with anticipated opening in Winter 2020.

3500 Chestnut Ave

(Bodhi Corner)

The proprietors of Bodhi Corner restaurant requested to transfer a Class "B" Beer Wine Liquor license from the former restaurant The Corner (now Nori Sushi). The proprietors met with the HCC ZLUC to discuss their plans. They emphasized having a limited, quality wine and beer selection with a local emphasis that would complement the food. Due to space constraints, very little liquor would be offered. The owner, Kevin Stevens, stated the restaurant would not provide table service and was not interested in delivering alcohol. The HCC completed an MOU with the proprietors. The BLLC approved the transfer at its October 24 hearing.

3602 Hickory Ave

(De Kleine Duivel)

The owners of The Bluebird have taken over the downstairs Belgian beer bar, De Kleine Duivel. During this transition, the owners obtained a new Class "B" restaurant liquor license. The owners indicated to the HCC that they plan to maintain the beer bar and add a small menu of food from the attached kitchen. The original tavern license for De Kleine Duivel can be transferred to another location in the area in the future, after a hearing before the BLLC. The ZLUC continues to monitor for this activity.

West 33rd St and Falls Cliff Rd

Two residents petitioned the City for a traffic study of the 900 block of West 33rd Street and the 3300 block of Falls Cliff Road. They were concerned with vehicles traveling at high rates of speed and safety issues. The HCC endorsed the requests for a traffic study and to solicit professional recommendations for possible traffic mitigation efforts.

Hampden Elementary/Middle School Updates

Hampden Elementary/Middle School (HEMS) continues to focus on bringing green issues and environmental education to its students. HEMS is currently applying to become an officially designated Maryland Green School, which involves a rigorous application process through the Maryland Association for Environmental and Outdoor Education.



Thanks to a community grant from the Hampden Community Council, Greenstreet Greenwalls is installing a living plant wall in the front hallway welcoming students, teachers, staff, and visitors to the school. This green installation will not only help clean the air inside the school, but will also offer the entire student body a hands-on environmental learning experience.

Students and teachers on the HEMS Green Team, with support from a grant from BGE and from the Friends of Hampden School, have been working to reclaim the back courtyard. Improvements include an extensive shade garden with native plants and edibles such as pawpaws, blueberries, and ferns, and also a pollinator garden and raised beds in the front of the schoolyard.

"The Green Team at HEMS is really proud of what we've accomplished so far teaming up with our community partners," says Ms. McNamara, second grade teacher and Green Team lead, "together with parents and neighbors we can inspire students in environmental stewardship and have HEMS become a designated Maryland Green School."
